

DAF's

- "Charitable Checking Account"
- Immediate tax deduction
- Tax-free growth
- Anonymity options
- Succession planning / Next-generation engagement

Planning Opportunity



Bunching

- Break through standard deduction
- Multiple years of annual donations in single tax year
- May have high-income year
- Example: Client gives \$10,000 annually to charity

IRA Charitable Rollover

Designated Funds



- Direct support to your favorite charity
- Endowment
- Specific programs or purposes

Planning Opportunity



QCD - IRA Rollover

- Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)
 - AKA "IRA Charitable Rollover"

- \$105,000 / year, per individual, age 70.5 and older
- Example: Endowing annual gift to church or favorite charity
 - \$20,000 gift = \$1,000 / year <u>forever</u>





Some routes will require you to stop at our Meals on Wheels headquarters. 3206 University Ave. in Des Moines, to load meals into your car. Other routes involve apartment complexes, and a Meals on Wheels driver already will have dropped off the meals you'll deliver to individual apartments.

Delivering a route will take you about 60 to 90 minutes.



Hydroponic Farm: Located on the lower level of our campus, the Prairie Meadows Hydroponic Farm — the nation's only hydroponic farm associated with a Meals on Wheels program - grows leafy greens without soil to healthily augment the meals we serve our clients and help combat food insecurity in the greater community. Volunteer opportunities are available within this nonprofit operation.



Take part in planting, harvesting, and preparing/packaging! Shifts are available Monday through Friday: 10 a.m. -12 p.m., 12 p.m. - 2 p.m., and 2 p.m. - 4 p.m.



No experience is necessary, and training is provided.



Bring a friend! Experiences are available for individuals or for small or large groups.





Friendly Caller Program: Volunteers can bring joy and connection to our most socially isolated clients with a friendly virtual visit. Anyone can take part!

- Phone a client once a week or once a month. Calls can be made between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. from any setting. Chat about anything you choose, and/or help our clients select their meals for the month!
- A guick set-up through Call Hub masks your telephone number to our clients to protect your privacy.
